**Most Eminent Knight Geoffrey C. Perry, G.C.T.  
Supreme Grand Master 2022 – 2024**

Geoffrey was born March 25, 1952, in Winnipeg, Manitoba. The family moved to Winnipeg when his father Harold was transferred to start the operations of the Esso refinery. Within the first year of his birth the family moved back to Sarnia, Ontario.

He attended Queen Elizabeth II elementary school. He initially attended St. Clair high school studying Auto mechanics and machine shop. He later transferred to Sarnia Northern and continued his studies in Auto mechanics and welding. Upon graduation he attended the University of Windsor studying Human Kinetics and graduating with a degree in Psychology. He married to his High School sweetheart MaryAnn Rombeek in 1976, and they moved to Windsor Ontario. He has a son Jonathan and a daughter Heather who has three children Aurora, Fiona, and Sullivan.

Upon graduation he was hired by CIBC into their management program. He left CIBC and worked as a Life Insurance Agent and from there he worked for McDonalds Canada as an Assistant Manager.

From 1982 until 1989 he worked as a private consultant for a number of Fortune 500 companies developing alternatives to antibiotics in animal feed. In 1989 he became a Customs Inspector for Canada Customs later to become Revenue Canada. He was a trained specialist in WSIB. He was later transferred to the Housing Rebate Officer position and approved the release of GST payments under the Housing Rebate Program. He was then later transferred to the Estates and Trust section and issued the release certificate for a deceased person's estate. He received a certificate of appreciation from CRA in 2004 for his valuable contribution to the promotion of the principles and practice of Alternate Dispute Resolution in the Southern Ontario Region. He was later a finalist in the CRA's national Award of Excellence for work in Alternate Dispute Resolution.

He retired from Revenue Canada in 2009 and returned to the field of Research and Development in the medical and technology sectors by creating New Venture Medical Group and New Visions Technology Group.

In 2010 he created New Venture Medical Group to research and develop treatments for various diseases and conditions. He helped in the development of a supplement to protect only healthy cells during radiation treatment for cancer treatments. There are additional applications for Nuclear technicians and aviation crews with cosmic radiation exposure. In addition, therapies for auto-immune diseases, allergies, malaria, and preliminary research on a HER/2 breast cancer vaccine.

In addition to New Venture Medical, he created additional businesses in the technical field to introduce cutting edge technology. He is involved with the waste to energy field using a plasma source to produce the high efficiency energy transfer necessary to make it viable. He is currently involved in the field testing of an organic product that has been proven to destroy the TR-4 and Black Sigatoka diseases affecting bananas all over the world. In addition to the agricultural applications, he is working on energy to waste projects in Africa.

**ADDRESS of the SUPREME GRAND MASTER**

Distinguished Guests and Fraters

As I sit here trying to write my report, there are several things that I would like to bring forth. It has been a great honour being the Supreme Grand Master of Sovereign Great Priory of Canada for the past two years. I have been fortunate over the past two years to have the support of the membership and a number of outstanding Knights. I would be remis if I did not thank my Provincial Grand Priors for the excellent work they did during their term of office. Their reports have enabled the officers of Sovereign Great Priory to better fulfil the obligations of their office.

In addition, I have had the privilege of being able to rely on the expertise of a number of outstanding Knights in the personage of M. Em. Kt. Gerry Tetzloff G.C.T, R. Em. Kt. Clive D. Stephenson K.C.T., R. Em. Kt. Ian Murray K.C.T., and R. Em. Kt. Terry Gould K.C.T.. Their advice and direction has enabled me to stay the course as we prepare Sovereign Great Priory to move forward and bring about certain changes required for us to advance Sovereign Great Priory into the future.

In Regina, we will deal with two Notice of Motions dealing with us moving forward and adjusting to the changing times. The first motion will deal with the current situation. The first being that 75% of our membership is deprived of being able to be active in the governance of Sovereign Great Priory. To move forward, we need to encourage the participation of **all** our members, not just a select few. By allowing them to participate, vote, it will encourage them to be more active and involved in the governance of Sovereign Great Priory. They are seasoned Masons with experience in a number of different Masonic bodies, so they are well versed in observing proper procedures. Their participation will greatly improve the ability of Sovereign Great Priory to properly service **all** of its membership.

The introduction of a night of educational presentations, rather than the exemplification of an Order on the Provincial Grand Priors visit, will enhance the members knowledge of the Order and assist them in the proper regulation of their Preceptory.

I have made some changes in the Executive structure of Sovereign Great Priory with a purpose in mind. I recently made a change to the Chairmanship of the Finance Committee. While this may seem to have been done late in the term of the chairmanship, it was done with sound judgment and an objective in mind. The budgets in the past have been general in nature with the expenditures not broken down in great detail. For the financial stability of Sovereign Great Priory, we must closely examine where and how our funds are dispersed. While M. Em. Kt. David Walker G.C.T. has been a strong stalwart protector of our finances, I have directed the new Chairman, R. Em. Kt. Ian Murray K.C.T., to review all the various expenditures and record them in an easy financial format. This will allow us to better

determine where the funds would better service the membership and possibly reallocate our assets accordingly. It will truly give us an accurate depiction of how much and where we need to allocate those resources. This will be the first in depth financial review of the assets, expenditures, and liabilities of Sovereign Great Priory in a significant period of time. This will allow us to see and understand the true financial situation of Sovereign Great Priory and allow us to establish a reliable long-range plan to ensure the financial stability of our organization.

This year at the Regina assembly I was to have the honor of officially recognizing the Great Priory of the Congo and the appointment of our Grand Representative R. Em. Kt. Robert Dupel. This has been delayed, and it is my hope we will have the pleasure to officially expand our outreach to other Priories around the world and welcome them into the fold of fellow Knights with the same purpose of mind in the near future.

We, Sovereign Great Priory, are not indifferent from any other entity in that progression from its primary state, such as a child, undergoes many physical and intellectual changes as it develops into an adult or its current form. This will be accepted by some and rejected by others who feel secure in its concurrent form. But change it must, for as the world around us changes as time progresses, must we also change to stay relevant and develop tools to meet the needs of the members.

When I was the Deputy Grand Master, I was asked where do I see Sovereign Great Priory down the line. I stated that we will enter into a rebuilding stage that will take about six years to accomplish. Substantial change cannot be made overnight but through progressive changes and a long-range plan. I believe that I have started part of the change and that R. Em. Kt. Clive D. Stephenson has the ability to continue the rebuilding of Sovereign Great Priory. This will give us 4 of the 6 years needed for the rebuilding process after Covid. You, as the membership, have the responsibility of deciding if that direction will continue into the last 2 years. This assembly will decide the direction of those last 2 years. You must consider the candidates running for the Deputy Grand Master and decide if you want to continue down this path and if so, select the candidate that has the experience and administrative ability to accomplish the tasks ahead.

I will now retire from my position of authority over the governance of Sovereign Great Priory to the Grand Master Elect R. Em. Kt. Clive D. Stephenson knowing that it is in capable hands and that as a Past Grand Master, I know what the term "Past" means and will govern my actions accordingly.

So, with this being my last report, I would like to again thank those who supported me during my term of office. I will carry with me those memorable moments we shared together and will always have that Bond of eternal friendship that we share. May our Great Redeemer look over you and your family and keep you all safe until we meet again.

**REPORT of the DEPUTY GRAND MASTER R. Em. Kt. Clive D. Stephenson, KCT**

Most Eminent Supreme Grand Master, Officers and Members of Sovereign Great Priory of Canada:

The journey continues, and I must say, while there have been challenges, the experience has been both educational and enjoyable.

The second year of my term started off with a full hip replacement in August, but I am happy to report that recovery has been full, and mobility is back to a high level. That being said, my crystal ball suggests another replacement, this time to my left knee, with this scheduled for November and recovery towards Christmas.

I have been fortunate over the past year still to be able to accompany the Supreme Grand Master on a number of fraternal and Official Visits and to be able to represent Sovereign Great Priory at other meetings and events.

I attended the Beothic Preceptory Christmas Observance Services, held virtually on Thursday December 21<sup>st</sup>. This was an enjoyable experience, and I commend Beothic for putting this on and extending an invitation. There were other observances but due to being in-person I was unable to attend. We are a Christian organization and as such we should be trying to hold these observances at a Preceptory or District level. I am currently leading a discussion about holding a Sovereign Great Priory Christmas Observance by zoom in December of this year. A similar discussion is being held regarding Easter and Ascension Day observances.

I participated in a number of “Town Hall meetings” called by the Supreme Grand Master with the purpose of having an open and frank discussion about items related to our organization. These meetings contained some difficult conversations but proved successful I think in identifying issues that need to be addressed in moving the operation of Grand Priory forward. A further Grand Executive meeting and Grand Council meeting will have been held before the Annual Assembly.

As with the previous year of my term, I have also had the pleasure of co-chairing the Condition of Masonry Committee with R. Em. Kt. Ian Murray KCT, to whom working with has been an enjoyable and educational experience.

As an ex-officio member of all Great Priory Committees, I have provided input where possible and where the opportunities presented themselves.

In May of this year, I represented Sovereign Great Priory at the Annual Assembly of the Royal and Select Masters of Ontario, filling in for the Supreme Grand Master who could not attend due to health issues.

On closing I would like to thank the members of Sovereign Great Priory for the confidence they have placed in me and the unwavering support I have been so fortunate to receive over the past two years. In particular, I would like to thank our Supreme Grand Master, M. Em. Kt. Geoff Perry GCT, who I have worked closely with, and would like to take this opportunity to again acknowledge the positive level of communication we have had and his dedication to the cause.

My stated appreciation to the members of Sovereign Great Priory is heartfelt and there are too many people to single out, but I would like to mention your Grand Chancellor, R. Em. Kt. ### GRAND TREASURER'S REPORT

The financial statements for the fiscal period July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, to June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024, have been reviewed by a Licensed Public Accountant. Electronic copies of the financial statements and year-end investment statements are available upon request.

The operations for the period generated a gain of \$701 over receipts of 76,844. Investments in the General Fund increased by \$29,591 to a balance of \$445,589. Investments in the Life Fund increased by \$20,853 to a balance of \$296,235. The total equity of the Sovereign Great Priory has increased by \$55,643 to \$824,653.

The operating and investment transactions are summarized with the statements being forwarded to the Chair of the Finance and the Chancery office on a quarterly basis.

**REPORT of the INVESTMENT COMMITTEE TRUSTEES**

**2024 Report of the Trustees**

At the time of drafting this report, the committee was not in receipt of the Grand Treasurer's Report and as such, we relied solely on the information provided by RBC Dominion Securities.

The Finance Committee, and Trustees, met with Trevor Roberts, RBC Dominion Securities, on July 24th and reviewed the portfolio performance for the past twelve months, ending June 30, 2024. Present, at this meeting, were M. Em. Kt. David Walker, GCT, R. Em. Kt. Clive D. Stephenson, KCT (Deputy Grand Master), R. Em. Kt. Howard Adams, KCT (Grand Chancellor), Mr. Roberts (RBC Dominion Securities) and myself.

As of June 30, 2023, our portfolio totaled \$698,717 and as of June 30, 2024, the total was \$767,456 (an increase of 9.8% over last year). This does not include just over \$27,000 taken into general revenues as interest earned. The increase in the portfolio was based on favourable market changes within the portfolio's assets. This translates to a five-year average return of 5.89% (as supplied by Mr. Roberts).

During this meeting, we reviewed the asset allocations and consensus was we should continue with the current investment strategies.

One question touched on, last year, is what is our long-term goal we wish to reach from our investments? We hope the incoming Supreme Grand Master will have this subject addressed in the upcoming year.

Based on our current investment strategies, we recommend no change for the immediate future.

Sir Knights, the purpose of this report is to identify both positive and negatives within our Order and offer suggestions to enhance and improve our Order.

A primary source of our information comes from two sources: the Notices from each Preceptory and the Provincial Grand Priors' Visitation Reports and Annual Summaries.

Over the past year, we have witnessed reoccurring issues:

- Preceptories closing or having to amalgamate.
- Assemblies being cancelled due to low actual or expected attendance.
- Preceptories not reading out, or distributing, Sovereign Great Priory reports including the Condition of the Order report.
- Preceptories not holding Christmas Observances, Easter or Ascension services.
- Preceptories having serious issues in getting Sir Knights to advance into senior Preceptory offices.

We think it is a strong probability for all, or at least most of the above, that they can simply be summarized as a "lack of overall interest." We feel that collectively, we are not doing enough to engage our membership. Some Preceptories excel at membership engagement while others are hardly giving it the attention it requires.

We need to change our approach if we wish to return to being a strong and vibrant Masonic body.

There are some very basic things we could collectively be doing to move things forward in a positive direction:

- Communicate effectively with your general membership. Share the Annual Reports with your Sir Knights. These forms of communication should include, but not be limited to, sharing by email, sharing in regular Assemblies and sharing in Notice papers.
- We are a Christian body, but we do little to promote it. We should invite another Preceptory, another Concordant body (especially Royal Arch Chapters), members of your Craft Lodge and their spouses to participate in your Christmas, Easter and Ascension Divine Services. These could easily be held by a webinar. If you need help, reach out to your Provincial Grand Prior, the Grand Chancellor, or even the Supreme Grand Master. There are plans being developed for a national Divine Serve for Christmas 2025.
- Start putting some thought into your Notice papers. Include pictures, links to interesting articles or anything similar. Give updates on progress made in various areas so everyone can share in the successes. A Notice Template is being developed for the use of those that need it.
- Take advantage of every opportunity to talk about the Knight Templarism with everyone not already a member. Consider doing an "open house" and invite all Masons to attend and possibly even members of the general public.

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- Encourage and promote webinars held by your District and Sovereign Great Priory.
- Followed personally by an in-person visit, or phone call with any Frater who has missed two or more Assemblies. Find out why they have been absent. Is there something we could do to help?
- Followed personally, by an in-person visit or phone call with any Frater who is about to take a demit. There is almost always a way to resolve any issue.
- Promote attendance to the Annual Assembly. It is amazing how attending these can make one feel more part of the fraternity. And of Great Priory.
- “Advertise”! By posters, brochures, web sites, attendance at other Masonic events (Annual Convocations of Royal Arch Grand Chapters, Annual Communication by your Grand Lodge are only two of the abundance of opportunities).
- Make your regular Assemblies interesting! This may be the single most important improvement you can make. Senior Preceptory officers need to plan Assemblies months ahead and ensure there is something in each agenda that will be engaging.
- The planning process should ensure your Assembly agendas cover the fundamentals, while paying special attention as to what would be engaging, fun and interesting. Yes, Assemblies can be fun and more to the point, they should be.

We need to revisit how we have done things in the past, collect the positive practices, embrace new technologies and ideas, work on engaging our membership and promoting our vision of the future.

Your senior Sovereign Great Priory officers are here to assist in any reasonable way possible. Simply just reach out and let us know.

## REPORT of the COMMITTEE on FUTURE PLACES OF MEETINGS

The visit was to negotiate arrangements with the Chateau Laurier. The proposal sent to us after our initial contact was not acceptable to either of our organizations. As there was no movement from the original proposal after a number of meetings with the Hotel we came to the conclusion that we could not afford to go to Quebec City in 2025. Therefore, the committee is recommending that we not pursue Quebec City for 2025.

An alternative site has been suggested by our members from Quebec. The suggestion is Montreal, using a downtown Hotel for accommodation and the use of the Grand Lodge Temple for our sessions. The committee is open to this suggestion as the Hotel and Grand Lodge Temple are in close proximity to one another.

The dates suggested for 2025 are August 17 to 20, 2025 at the SENS Hotel. Queen room at \$239.00 plus taxes per night. Single or Double occupancy. The Committee therefore recommends Montreal for the 2025 Assemblies of GICC and SGP at the SENS Hotel and Grand Lodge of Quebec Temple.

### **Report on Christian Education Committee**

To the Supreme Grand Master, M. Em. Kt. Geoffrey Perry, GCT, and members of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada:

There have been no requests as to Christian Education vis-à-vis papers, sermons or general inquiries. However, there was a question as to the differences among the Great Priories as to the Christian prerequisites for membership. These basically come down to the view of the Great Priory/Grand Encampments. Some see Christianity from a unitarian perspective and others from a Trinitarian one. Our Great Priory views the prerequisite as a Trinitarian requirement with the belief in the One Holy and Indivisible Three-in-One God.

Christmas Observances and Easter Observances have again been celebrated by many of the Preceptories. However, we would reiterate that these observances should not over-shadow the Divine services of one's denominational attendance. In fact, it would be ideal to be able to celebrate both and in concert one with the other.

The committee also notes that several Districts do hold their annual District meetings in conjunction with District Divine Services held at the home church of the Provincial Grand Prior(s).

We would express our thanks the Supreme Grand Master, M. Em. Kt. Geoffrey Perry, GCT, for his Christmas and Easter messages as well as his encouragement to the Preceptories to hold Observances.

#### **Recommendations:**

1. That when we organize the educations sessions at Sovereign Great Priory assemblies, the committee be asked to prepare talks for the sessions with both the Officer and PGP blocks.
2. That communications between the Chaplains of Preceptories and The Sovereign Great Priory be implemented so that Preceptory Chaplains might be better prepared to do a short talk at their respective Preceptories on a regular basis.

### **Report of the Fraternal Recognition Committee 2024**

#### **Inquiries:**

Two inquiries on the procedures to establish recognition and the exchange of Grand Representatives with the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada were received: the newly created Great Priory of Brazil (October 29, 2023), and the Great Priory of Italy (May 28, 2024). Both Great Priories have been informed on the procedure and required information.

**Petition:**

On May 15, 2024, the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada has received a petition for a third time from the Great Priory of Congo. As mentioned in the 2022 Fraternal Recognition Committee Report, the Great Priory of Congo was constituted in October 2021 by the Supreme Grand Master of the Great Priory of Benin with the presence of the Supreme Grand Master of the Great Priory of France.

**Analysis:**

The Great Priory of Congo has provided a copy of their Constitution, Statutes and Regulations, and a copy of their Rituals. In fact, the 2021 constituted Great Priory of Congo adopted the same Constitution, Statutes, Regulations and Rituals that are in use by the Great Priorities of Benin and France, verbatim translation of those of the Great Priory of England, Wales, etc. Their candidates must profess the belief in the Christian Trinity.

Previously, this Committee did not recommend recognition because the Grand Lodge of Congo and Grand Chapter of RAM of Congo, from which they draw their members, were not recognized by our regular Canadian Grand Bodies. They were therefore advised that, should their Grand Lodge and RAM Grand Chapter be recognized, our Great Priory would be pleased to accept recognition and the exchange of Grand Representatives.

Their Grand Lodge and RAM Grand Chapter are now recognized by our Canadian Grand Bodies. Accordingly, on May 25, 2024, R.W. Bro. Jean Lounana Kouta, Pro Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Congo, was officially received at the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Quebec A.F. & A.M. In attendance were several Canadian Grand Masters. However, the Great Priory of Congo and RAM Grand Chapter of Congo are under administrative review and presently not recognized as concordant Congo bodies by the Congo Grand Lodge. An official decision will be made regarding their status at the Grand Communication of the Grand Lodge of Congo on October 18, 2024.

**Recommendation:**

To wait for the Congo Grand Lodge decision on the status of the Congo Great Priory an RAM Chapter before recommending recognition of the Great Priory of Congo and the exchange of Grand Representatives.

The Committee recommends Saskatoon #55 Preceptory for the DA King Award in 2024. This Preceptory is nominated because all members photographed wore proper uniform including gloves, with six members furthermore armed ceremonially with swords.

### **Report of the Provincial Grand Prior Instruction Committee 2023-24**

Most Eminent Supreme Grand Master, Officers and Members of Sovereign Great Priory of Canada:

One of the main duties of this Committee is to put on the in-person Provincial Grand Prior (PGP) Seminar at the Annual Assembly for the in-coming or returning PGP's. Remembering that the term for a PGP is 2 years, this was successfully completed in August of 2022 and attendance at the seminar also included many of the District Secretaries who would be assuming their District roles going forward.

Being that the term for the PGP is now 2 years it was recognized that follow-up meetings for the PGP's would be beneficial, and also the general availability of the members of the Committee to answer questions. One of the important elements of these additional meetings and conversations was the ability to identify issues early and to develop and share solutions.

As previously reported, in September of 2022 a zoom meeting was hosted by the Committee and the PGP's and the District Secretaries were invited to attend. One of the main issues covered during this meeting was the various forms requiring submission to Sovereign Great Priory. We also covered quite a few items of protocol and a number of contentious issues relevant to the duties of the Provincial Grand Prior. The discussion was lively, and we feel that the PGP's and District Secretaries ended the meeting with a much better understanding of what is required of them.

A second zoom meeting was held in November of 2023 with the focus here to talk about challenges and solutions over the first year or so of the PGP term. A wide variety of topics were covered, illustrating much commonality within our jurisdiction, but also illustrating some very unique talking points. Feedback after this meeting was very positive and it illustrated the value of this communication medium and the ability to share information and experiences. It

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also sent a strong message that more meetings of this type would be of considerable value in helping the PGP's deliver on their responsibilities.

The Provincial Grand Prior Instruction Manual was reviewed and updated by your committee in 2022, and minor updates have been implemented since. The Committee is indebted to the prior authors of this publication for the quality of information contained therein. We did not reinvent the wheel; we just tried to improve and update it.

As expected, there will be an in-person Provincial Grand Prior (PGP) Seminar held at the Annual Assembly in Regina, and it is hoped that as many as possible of the new PGP's and District Secretaries will be in attendance.

It is imperative that the Provincial Grand Prior is knowledgeable regarding the statutes, ritual and processes of Sovereign Great Priory. And where there are gaps in this knowledge, he needs to know where and/or how to find this information. Your Committee is confident that the material covered in the seminar goes a long way to meeting these targets. However, and this is an important recommendation going forward, we need follow-up meetings with the PGP's and District Secretaries to collectively discuss issues they are having, to share success stories and build the team approach as they serve Sovereign Great Priory. It is recommended that these be held quarterly by zoom with both the PGP's and the District Secretaries invited.

The members of the Committee would like to thank the Supreme Grand Master for the opportunity to serve Sovereign Great Priory, and we feel that this committee serves an important function in helping ensure the Provincial Grand Prior's are better prepared for their term in office and in becoming better leaders within our organization.

### **Report of the Preceptory Officer Instruction Committee 2023-24**

Most Eminent Supreme Grand Master, Officers and Members of Sovereign Great Priory of Canada:

The mandate of this committee is in part to provide instructional educational material to Preceptory Officers, both those currently in officer positions and those aspiring to become so. This material while including information specific to holding office in the Preceptory, it is broader than this and touches on a number of aspects pertinent to Knight Templarism.

As previously reported, a successful Preceptory Officer Seminar was delivered at the 2022 Annual Assembly of Sovereign Great Priory, held in Mississauga, Ontario. However, as previously identified, this approach only reaches those Knights who are at the Assembly, and

it has been recognized that more broadly focused and available in-year education is also required.

Starting in 2021-22 your committee initiated the development of a series of educational PowerPoint presentations that are or will be available to the Preceptories and earlier this year, a number of educational papers were posted on the Sovereign Great Priory website. All of these educational pieces are also available by contacting any member of the committee.

In addition, your committee has available, a compiled a list of current ritual, governance and other publications which should be used by Preceptories. This list includes only those publications authorized by Sovereign Great Priory, and as such, any other material should not be used or used with extreme caution.

We would invite Preceptories to reach out to any member of the Committee and suggest a topic that you think would be useful as an educational tool. The Committee is open to developing the concept within the Committee or working with the Preceptory to develop the idea.

The “Education” page within the Sovereign Great Priory Website continues to be very popular being accessed 360 times from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024 (*V. Em. Kt. James Leutri, Chairman, Electronic Management Committee Report 2022-24*). As such an increase in quality material on this page will most likely result in more use of this web-based resource.

Looking forward, the committee will be charged with highlighting existing material or developing new material (guidelines?) to assist the Presiding Preceptor and Officers in the performance of their duties. Another initiative will be the development of a “Notice Template” to assist Preceptories with their Meeting Notices as required.

The members of the Committee would like to thank the Supreme Grand Master, M. Em. Kt. Geoff Perry GCT, for the opportunity to serve Sovereign Great Priory and we feel that this committee serves an important function in providing educational opportunities to the Preceptory officers and those desiring to be one, thereby developing the future leaders of our organization.

The new materials include three new retractable banner designs with Q.R. codes leading visitors to the applications page on the Sovereign Grand Priory of Canada's website, an 8.5" by 11", 2-sided full-color glossy flyer outlining the ideals, pre-requisites and joining process for the Masonic Knights Templar which any preceptory can print out at minimal cost to themselves on their own printers or through a local print store, an updated PowerPoint slideshow, and a video file of the PowerPoint presentation which can run on a TV or monitor placed on the display table at Grand Lodge or another Masonic event.

The newly created marketing material represents a significant step forward in promoting the Masonic Knights Templar.

New Marketing Material Overview:

### **New Banners:**

The banners are easily transportable and visually appealing, designed to attract attention at events and provide visitors with a seamless experience through a Q.R. code leading them to the applications page on the Sovereign Grand Priory website: <https://sovereigngreatprioryofcanada.ca/how-to-join/>

### **The 3 Banner Designs**

The first is an "Overview Banner," which can be used as a standalone banner if only one is printed by a preceptory. It draws attention with captivating visuals, a strong impact statement, and a "call-to-action" to either visit the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada's website or scan a QR code, taking them to the "How to Join" page on the website. This banner has already been printed (a donation by me) and garnered attention at the last two Grand Lodge assemblies.

The next banner details the different orders of our organization: The Illustrious Order of the Red Cross, The Order of Malta (Order of St. Paul/Mediterranean Pass and Order of Knight of St. John), and the Order of The Temple (Novice, Installation, and Consecration).

The last banner includes the five banners or shields from the Order of St. Paul/Mediterranean Pass. This displays the five banners in a vertical concept, with the first being white with the word "Palestine, 1099" and the letter B, the second being red with the word "Cyprus, 1287" and the letter L, the third being black with the word "Rhodes, 1310" and the letter D, fourth,

being purple with the word “Candia, 1523” and the letter R, and fifth, being gold with the word “Malta, 1530” and the letter A.

### **New Flyer:**

The 8.5" by 11" flyer is a concise informational tool, showcasing the ideals of the Masonic Knights Templar, along with the necessary pre-requisites for those interested in joining while being easy to read, condensed, and printed at a reduced cost compared to a Quadra-fold or Tri-fold brochure. It serves as an impactful introduction for potential candidates while being produced on a budget.

This flyer is in PDF format and can be easily distributed by email to the individual preceptories or potential candidates. Any preceptory will also be able to print this flyer, either on their own printer or at a local print shop with minimal cost, and it can be displayed at the sign-in table or handed out to prospective new candidates. On request of The Supreme Grand Master, M. Em. Kt. Geoffrey C. Perry G.C.T. it should be distributed to the 58 Preceptories throughout Canada.

### **New PowerPoint/PDF Presentation:**

The updated PowerPoint slideshow brings a fresh and dynamic approach to our presentations, making them engaging and relevant to modern audiences. With updated graphics and content, it ensures that our message is effectively conveyed. It also removed some language and references that may be considered controversial. On request of The Supreme Grand Master, M. Em. Kt. Geoffrey C. Perry G.C.T. it should be distributed to the 58 Preceptories throughout Canada.

### **New Video Presentation:**

### **Observations from Grand Lodge:**

During the recent Grand Lodge Convocation on Wednesday, July 17th, 2024, marketing efforts were successful. Approximately 75 people visited the booth, and 28 flyers were distributed. The Supreme Grand Master, M. Em. Kt. Geoffrey C. Perry G.C.T. and Sir Knight Alistair Munro made valuable connections with interested Masons by explaining the values of joining Preceptory, handing out the new flyers, and in some cases, taking people's contact details in order to help them find a Preceptory near them. We propose that this practice be continued.

**Acknowledgments:**

The retractable banner, updated flyers, PowerPoint presentation, and video were created by me at no cost to the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada. Only the printing costs of the banners are being charged to the Priory.

**Future Events:**

In conclusion, the new marketing material, including the retractable banner, updated flyers, PowerPoint slideshow, and video presents a significant improvement in promoting the Masonic Knights Templar and the Sovereign Great Priory. **KNIGHT TEMPLAR CHARITABLE FOUNDATION**

The Financial Statement for the year ended December 31, 2023, have been completed and audited and submitted for inclusion in the Preliminary Annual Proceedings.

**Income Statement**

Income from operations for the year was \$39,122 (KTCF) and \$9,375 (CEW) for a consolidated income of

\$48,497 versus \$41,600 last year. This increase was mainly due to increased Investment Income: \$27,842 versus \$24,401 last year. Other/Non-Capital Donations were also higher: \$16,255 versus \$12,699 last year. Non-bursary donation expenditures were higher: \$12,000 versus \$9,000 last year. The Consolidated Surplus before investment gains/losses was \$20,141 versus \$16,370 last year.

Realized gain on sale of investments: \$5,023 versus \$1,328 last year. Taking into account realized and unrealized gain/loss, the overall net gain of the fund was \$60,781 gain versus \$(69,642) loss last year.

**Balance Sheet**

The total equity of the fund was \$597,132 (KTCF) and \$200,351 (CEW) for a consolidated equity of \$797,483 versus \$736,702 last year.

**Disbursement Quota**

The 2023-24 disbursement quota for the fund is \$26,848. It is important to note that the disbursement quota applies to the consolidated fund value (KTCF + CEW).

**Professional Fees**

In the 2023 fiscal year we paid \$1,243 in professional fees to MNP LLP for compilation of financial information, basically producing the same financial reports as the Treasurer. These fees continue to go up; our accountant now works for a larger firm and CRA is ever demanding more detail in the process. I do not see anything in our bylaws stating that we use a Licensed Public Accountant. The Government of Canada Charities Directorate notes:

*“if you have income over \$250,000, the Charities Directorate recommends that you get a financial statement professionally audited; otherwise, the treasurer for the charity should sign them.”*

Our total 2023 income was \$48,497. As Treasurer, I would be comfortable compiling and signing the financial reports as long as someone with an accounting background voluntarily reviews my work. I do have a volunteer from my Preceptory willing to do this. I therefore propose that we no longer use the service of a Licensed Public Accountant and that the Treasurer compile and sign the financial reports.

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## RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

### *Ancient Craft Masons –*

Commence their era with the creation of the world, calling it Anno Lucis (A.L.), “in the year of light.” Add 4000 years to the common era: thus 4000 and 2019 = 6019

### *Royal Arch Masons –*

Date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, calling it Anno Inventionis (A.I.), “in the year of discovery.” Add 530 years to the common era: thus 530 and 2019 = 2549

### *Order of High Priesthood –*

Date from the blessing of Abram by the High Priest Melchizedek, calling it Anno Benefacio (A.B.), “in the year of Blessing.” Add 1913 years to the common era, thus 1913 and 2019 = 3932

### *Royal and Select Masters –*

Date from the year in which the Temple of Solomon was completed, calling it Anno Depositionus (A.Dep.), “in the year of deposit.” Add 1000 years to the common era: thus 1000 and 2019 = 3019

### *Knights Templar –*

Commence their era with the organization of the Order, Anno Ordinus (A.O.) “in the year of the Order” From the Christian era take 1118, thus 1118 from 2019 = 901

### *Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite –*

Same as Ancient Craft, except Jewish Chronology is used. Anno Mundi (A.M.), “in the year of the world.” Add 3760 to the common era, thus 3760 and 2019 = 5779
